Attorney Ruess summarized the Staff Report and informed the Board of available options on how to fill the vacancy and the various timelines.

President Burke provided an overview of the issue of rebuilding Station 41 at the proposed new location.

Assistant Chief Cole provided comments regarding the viability and positive attributes of the proposed location for the new station.

Extensive Board discussion occurred.

C. Review and Approve Commercial Land Appraisal Proposal

President Burke provided comment on this issue and expressed concerns regarding the financial ramifications.

PRESIDENT BURKE made a motion to approve the appraisal that has been recommended by Staff. The motion failed due to the lack of a second.

D. Review and Approve Station 40 Paving Project Proposal

Assistant Chief Cole summarized the Staff Report and recommended that the Board award the contract for management and oversight of design, specification, project development, and bidding portions of the project to Chad Hooker, Property Services, Inc. in the amount of \$3,200.
