CalTrans will be starting work on Highway 92 next week for the next two weeks to start on the slide area. Traffic will not be stopped. He spoke about the Half Moon Bay Disaster Day and the County's Disaster Preparedness day.

H. <u>CERT Report</u>

Director Sherrill spoke about Coastside Gives and \$20,000 was raised. She spoke about an upcoming radio training in June and Coastside Preparedness Day which will occur on June 10, 2023. The national CERT conference is being held in Burlingame.

Battalion Chief/Fire Marshal Pat Griffin spoke about inspections. The fee study project will be moving forward. The Town Hall for vegetation management was an informative meeting and they will follow up with a second meeting in June.

Deputy Fire Chief Jonathan Cox spoke about the wildfire evacuation repopulation training at three locations throughout the County.

Regarding the North Peak access road to Montara Mountain, the work should be starting soon now that the weather has stopped.

The RFP for the fee study was awarded. They are still working on the County ALS JPA ont eh coast design build out for control for Command 41.

Regarding staffing, they are trying to get expired credentials and training up to date.

Regarding outreach, the Wildfire Safety Town Hall took place. The station 40 and Station 44 open houses were conducted.

Regarding facilities, the five year inspection for the training tower has been completed. Chief Silva has proceeded with purchasing the Starlink backup internet for all three facilities. An RFP will be brought to the Board for replacing the insulation in the apparatus bay at Station 40.

Regarding apparatus, the ERV is still being outfitted with custom seating. Engines 44 and 340 are in line to be built. They are working on getting invoices processed for the AO17's.
